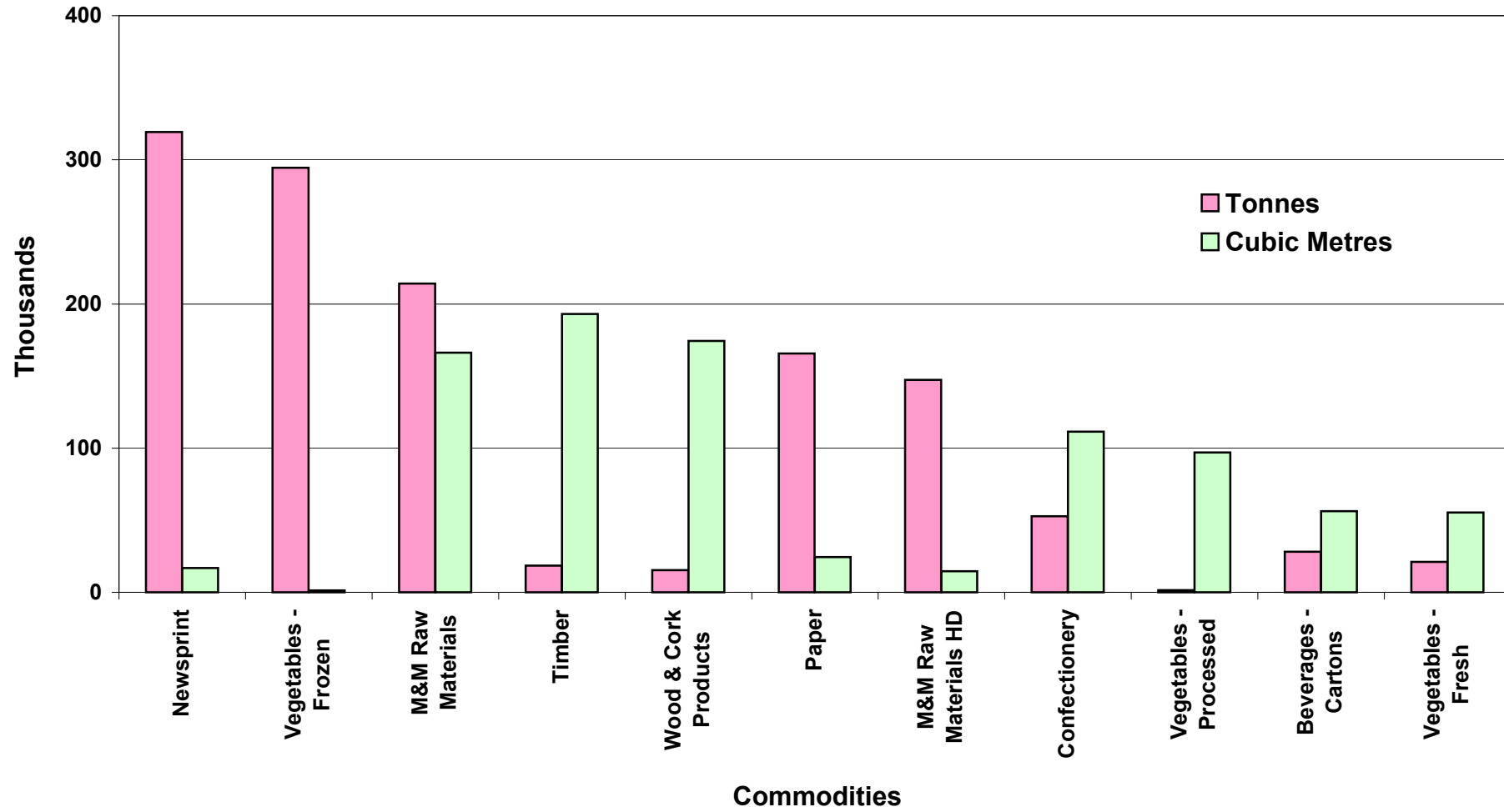

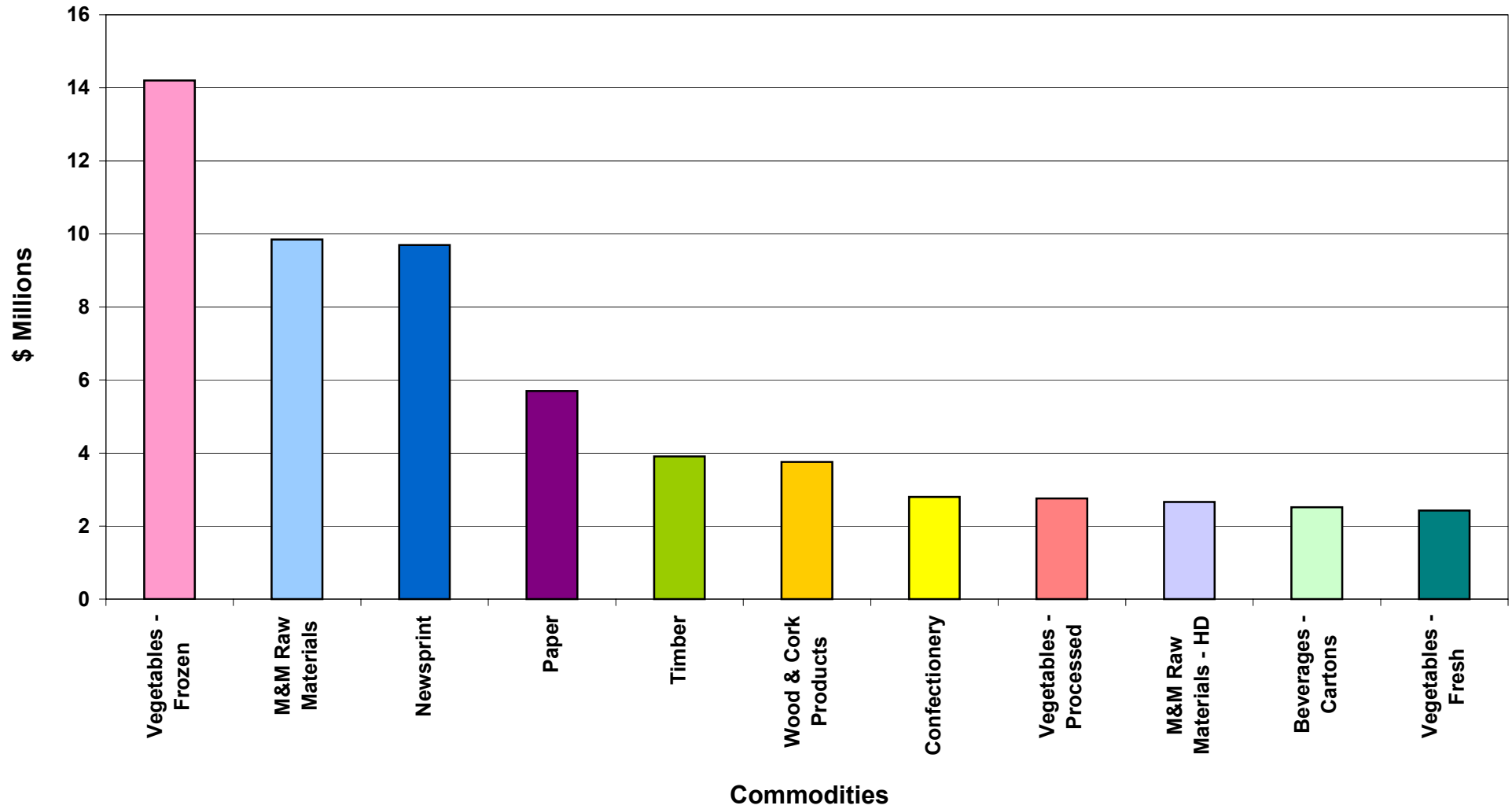

TFES ASSISTANCE FOR MAJOR COMMODITIES SHIPPED IN 2002/2003



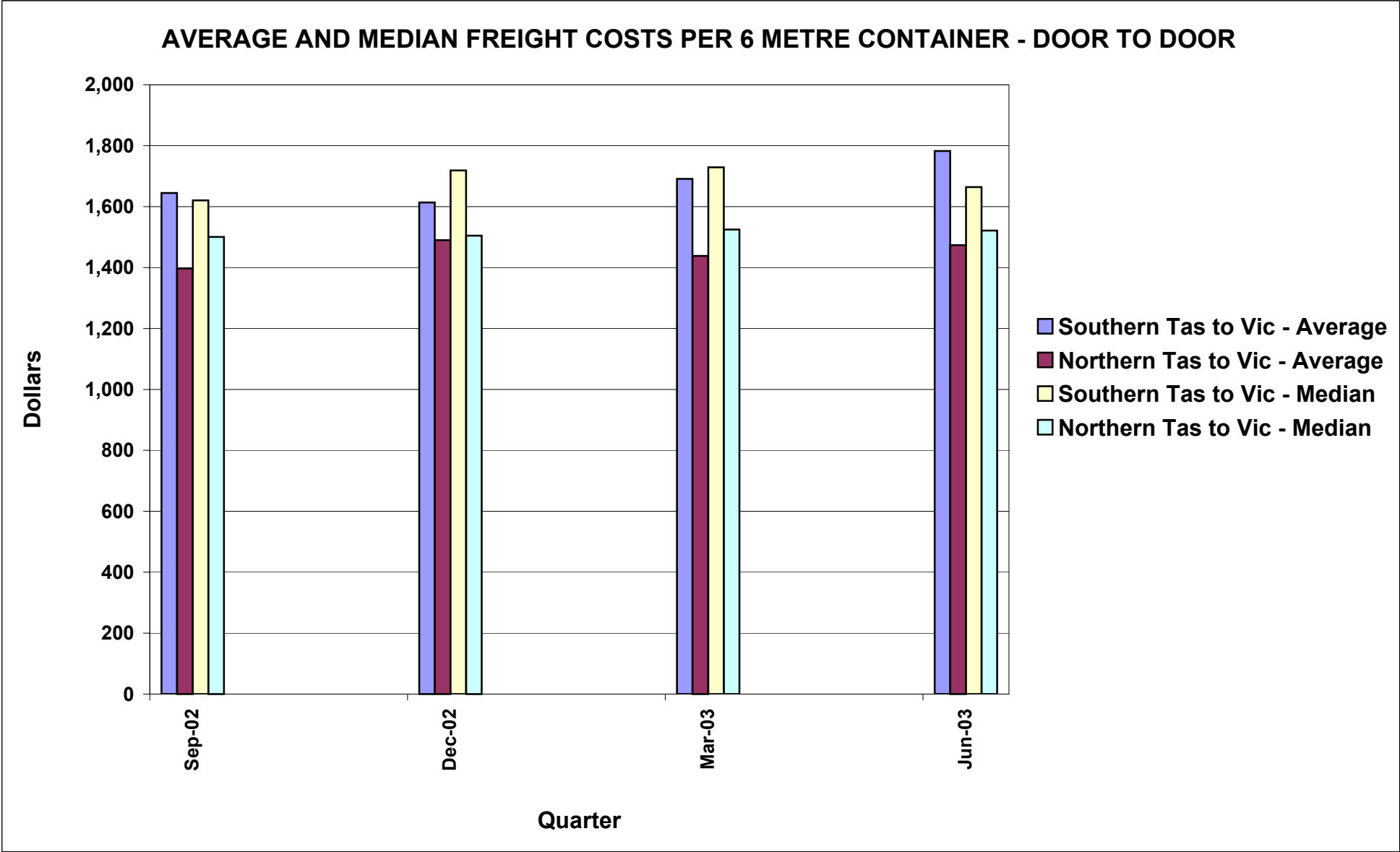
